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WHAT IS GUIDED READING? - Scholastic

Guided reading is a practice which promotes opportunities for the development of a self-extending system (Fountas and Pinnell, 1996). Teacher ' s role in guided reading Teachers select texts to match the needs of the group so that the students, with specific guidance, are supported to read sections or whole texts independently.

The guided reading concept was originally developed by Marie Clay and others in New Zealand in the 1960s, and was developed further in the US by Fountas and Pinnell. With guided reading, teachers work with small groups of students whom they have assessed to be reading at similar levels, providing them with level-appropriate books and problem-solving guidance.

Guided reading is one component of the shared reading block during which the teacher provides support for small, flexible groups of beginning readers. The teacher helps students learn to use reading strategies, such as context clues, letter and sound knowledge, and syntax or word structure, as they read a text or book that is unfamiliar to them.

Guided Reading was developed in New Zealand in the 1960s. Later, when it came the United States, educators including Gay Su Pinnell and Lesley's own Irene Fountas enhanced it over time. In 1996, Fountas & Pinnell published their highly influential text, *Guided Reading: Good First Teaching for All Children* (Heinemann). This text revolutionized the teaching of reading, and is still used by over a million teachers worldwide.
